

Theory and Ear Training for String Students: Integration in Group and Private Lessons

Goal of Session

Method of Delivery

- Separate Theory Classes
- Extended Group Time
- **Incorporate into 60" Group Lesson**
- Incorporate into Private Lesson

Beginning Ear Training

- Sunflower... solfege, fixed do, with whole body motion
 - Scale and Arpeggio in D Major
 - Name that tune
 - Small Songs
 - Sing then play on violin
 - Sing with words then solfege
 - Intervals ascending from tonic in major scale
- Sing Good-bye using descending m3 (A-F#)
- Copy Cat Game
 - Requires students to repeat 1 or 2 notes by ear without seeing the teacher
- Recognize basic chord qualities M, m, Aug, dim.

Next stage

- Solfege with hand signs
 - Scale and arpeggio
 - Intervals ascending from tonic in major scale
 - Bk. I pieces in D Major
 - A slightly more complex song from folk repertoire
 - Ex. Green Gravel
- Harmony
 - Simply writing M or m based on what kind of chord is played
 - Building triads on the instrument

Basic Goals by the time students graduate

- Has a well-developed sense of pulse
- Reads rhythms easily and accurately
- Able to sight read proficiently
- Sings and recognizes intervals both written and aural
- Can identify intervals on the instrument and in repertoire
- Chords
 - Recognizes basic chord qualities aurally
 - Understands chord construction
 - Can do simple analysis in repertoire
- Form and phrasing
 - Can analyze simple forms
 - Can analyze and interpret phrase structure
- Key signatures
 - Can identify major and minor key signatures
 - Can write the key signature or name the sharps or flats in a key signature when given the name of a key
 - Understands relative minor and parallel minor relationships
- Vocabulary and symbols
 - Can work with tempo, dynamic, and other music vocabulary and identify and use musical symbols
